

PRIVACY POLICY

This Privacy Policy sets out the principles of processing and protection of personal data provided by Users in connection with registration for the Event.

The service performs the functions of obtaining information about users and their behaviour in the following way: by means of voluntarily entered information in forms and by collecting "cookies" files.

In accordance with Article 13(1) and (2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) (OJ EU L 119, p. 1) - hereinafter referred to as the 'ORD' - we inform you that:

Administrator of personal data

Objectives and basics of the processing

Processing of your data will be done in order to contact in organizational matters and to prepare a personal list of participants of the Sopot Summit 2020 Event, which will be held on July 20-26, 2020 in Warsaw.

Right to object

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data at any time.

Rights of data subjects:

According to GDPR, you are entitled to it:

- a) The right to access your data and receive a copy of it;
- b) The right to correct (correct) your data;
- c) the right to erasure, restriction of data processing;

(Note: access, deletion or restriction of the processing of your data must comply with the legal provisions under which the processing is carried out)

(d) the right to object to the processing;

(e) the right to data portability;

(Please note that a positive decision on your objection to the processing or the right to transfer your data must comply with the legal provisions on the basis of which the processing is carried out, as well as, inter alia, with the principles of the Code of Administrative Procedure!).

Information on the requirement/voluntary provision of data

Providing personal data is voluntary, but necessary to participate in the Sopot Summit 2020 Event.

You have the right to file a complaint with the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection when you decide that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (general regulation on personal data protection).

Automated decision making

Your data will not be processed in an automated manner or in the form of profiling.
